### NIGHT GLOW REINS

For those that ride at night, for pleasure or for conditioning, it is a comfort to know that you can be seen from a distance. Since you have to use reins anyway, why not make them double as a safety feature. Glow tack helps others see you if you are out at night. In the daylight it's a translucent soft white. It glows lime green in the shade and at night and lit as long as it is near body heat.

The reins I had made are of beta biothane, with intermittent glow overlay. They stayed visible as long as I was out, clearly visible. They are easy to clean, very supple, easy on my hands, and come in an array of colors that you can add an overlay to. Moss Rock will make the reins any length or color you need, even add bling for you. Custom made tack expresses you as an individual, give your horse some added personality and it is less expensive than leather.

In addition to reins, she makes halters and bridles, including the Bitless bridle. Biothane doesn't absorb smells like nylon and stays very supple in the winter, even if it gets wet. It looks like leather, but is much more versatile. It never feels clammy or sticky as rubber reins can when wet.

There are so many ways you can make biothane for your everyday needs, customize it be one of a kind. Biothane will last a lifetime, with very little care.
