Last month I tried a new saddle pad. I liked the idea of what it did. It is a no concussion pad! If you drop a hard object on it, it will not bounce; trying that with my other pads, they do produce a bounce. So this proves that it keeps bouncing and movement to a minimum on a horses back.

The pad itself, the Thinline Saddle Pad is a very thin (about ½") pad that is very shock absorbing. It is a trademarked open cell technology that promotes air and moisture to flow around and through it reducing heat on your horses back.

What I really liked about it, is that it fit the back of my horse, molded to her shape and the bareback pad I use did **not slip** at all. It was in the same place after hours of riding that it was in when we left. It is easy to take care of, just hose it off and it dries pretty quickly. You can put it in the machine as well, which I tried and it came out sparkling clean, no problems! They come in many shapes and she will even custom make a pad to fit your saddle. It is thin enough so that it will not interfere with the fit of your saddle, but will help ease the pressure on your horses back.

I have tried to destroy it!! I have ridden in water, thick brush, ridden for hours and it is still in great shape. It does not compress and will not bunch up or move at all.

This is one of the easiest pads to use and take care of that I have tried.
