Baretek bareback pad
Thinline pad

Someone told me about this bareback pad and it looked really comfortable, both for the horse and myself. Since I am a bareback fan, I had to try it out. First, it is very lightweight and easy to handle and carry. The billets are long enough to use a dressage girth. It doesn't move or turn once it is on and is a very comfortable pad. The knee rolls are in the perfect place and the pommel/cantle are just far enough apart to allow you to find your seat. The withers are cut back to insure no rubbing on the horse at all. The times that I used it, there were no sore spots. All I used as a pad is the Thinline pad and both together were a perfect match.



The seat is very cushioned and also allows you to sit where it is best. This type of pad is excellent to use to perfect your balance and learn to move with your horse. Anyone just learning to ride, should use a pad like this to learn balance. The felt underside is easy to clean, just

wipe down with water or hose and dry.

For anyone wanting to learn to ride with balance, this is the pad to use.
