I have found a safety strap for halters that makes the idea of keeping halters on horses a bit more palatable. Keeping a halter on a horse all the time is dangerous, but for those times when you have to put a halter on your horse and leave him a while, there is a safety strap that works great. It is from Snap Backs and is an elastic extension that attaches to the halter and will break away with less exertion than leather. It reduces the risk of neck and spinal injury as well, if a horse pulls back and the halter does not give at all. They are not expensive, only \$6.75 and could save lots of money on vet bills. They also make an adjustable girth that I have only used a few times, not extensively, so I can only report on how it has been so far. It has not caused any discomfort at all, which many neoprene girths can cause. These have elastic ends that stretch and enable you to tighten the girth and not get it overly tight. It is easy to clean and because of the stretchy. One girth will virtually fit all your horses. It is easy to clean and is extremely well made.



Last, since it is that time of the year and flies seem to overlook fly sprays and any other method we try, I have had to resort to just keeping them off my horses legs. There are many brands and kinds of leg wraps, but I chose the least expensive since they don't last but one season. I have tried the expensive ones and they also only last maybe one season, so no sense in spending the extra money. These are 20.00 for 4 and can be washed and have lasted as long or longer than the expensive ones. They are from Country Supply.... www.countrysupply.com These have a neoprene edge binding so they are non-abrasive.
